Two windows of my flat are within two metres of the building in question and the extra two levels will dramatically change the outlook from my flat. There is also the prospect of noise late into the evening from office staff on the proposed terrace - which is 2 metres from my bedroom. The outlook under these proposals would be a solid wall in very close proximity to my windows and would substantially reduce my sense of privacy in my own flat. This development would have an oppressive and overbearing sense of enclosure and would mean that my rooms would feel entombed by such a large building so close.</p> <p>My bedroom windows are south facing and this development would have a significant negative impact on daylight, sunlight and outlook. It is not just the impact of being overlooked that concerns me but also the loss of privacy as office staff in the new building will look straight into my bedroom. It will be difficult to open the windows or even the curtains and therefore two of my rooms will feel effectively windows and almost like a prison. A room without daylight would have a negative impact on my mood and quality of life.</p> <p>The proposed development is contrary to the provisions of the local Development Plan and will have a huge negative impact on residents in the 20 flats in the Summers Street building and should be refused.</p>

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
