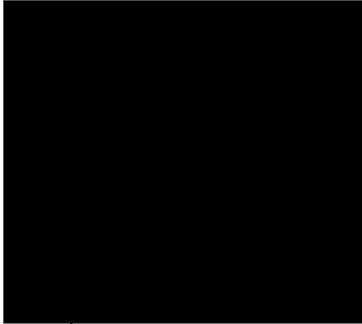

The planning permission must not be approved, because the building will increase the air pollution in the area (through the use of the CHP energy centre), which is already way above the legal limit. It is therefore illegal to do that.

(People in the area are being told that the building is already beginning, without the planning permission, only with the hope that it will be obtained – and when it should not be given.)

In this extremely polluted area, of Brill Place (with readings of eg 46 and 60, when the legal limit is 40 – and tiny increases, research has shown, causes more heart attacks), any new connections to Somers Town CHP energy centre will increase pollution in a residential area. The energy would be being supplied to new energy users, when the pollution level should not be increased in this extremely polluted area, which is also very much residential.

(The Somers Town Forum has backed up this view, and following the help of a key pollution expert in the country, who has stated that no new buildings should be added to the CHP energy centre, because of the pollution in the area).
