Dear Mr. Bell and Mr. Little,

The Redington Frognal Conservation Area has lost 40% of its trees and 26% of its leaf canopy in just six years (2010 to 2016).

On page 26 of the attached Heritage and Character Appraisal for the Conservation Area it is noted that,

"Trees within private gardens............contribute significantly to the character of the area. Hedges commonly form boundaries to front gardens but there is evidence that these have been removed in places. Where these formal hedges have been retained they create an attractive edge between the buildings and the street........"

A report on the Contribution of Trees to the Townscape Character is also attached and we would draw your attention to Section 72 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, as Amended.

The Neighbourhood Forum is greatly opposed to the felling of trees for the purpose of facilitating development. We should like to apply for tree preservation orders to be served on all those trees that have been identified for felling, including any with some rotten wood, the veteran oak tree, the European silver fir and, if possible, on the row of yew trees which form the boundary hedges. All of the trees are visible from the street and can be seen in the attached photos.
