Planning Application 35 - 37 Fairfax Road (2019/4826/P)

I refer to your Email of 6 March 2020 on the above

I submitted my comments on 7 November 2019. in which I said , that as my house in Fairfax Place is the nearest to 35 - 37 Fairfax Road, I am very concerned about the noise and the Council should decide the appropriate hours of opening. In the agent's latest submission, the hours have been increased from 63 to 85 hours. This is totally unacceptable.

Also I said that if the planning application is approved, the back entrance to 35 - 37 Fairfax Road should be kept looked except between the hours of 08.00 and 18.00. The agent has not commented on this.

Regarding the rubbish, it is not acceptable to have the green bin in the service road for the rubbish - while they have been at 47 Fairfax Road they have recently taken to having the bin outside the back of 35 - 37 Fairfax Road (please see my previous submission) - they do not keep it locked now so I have no faith in them keeping the bin locked if they move to 35 - 37 Fairfax Road. Alternative arrangements need to be made for the rubbish.

Unless both the hours of opening and the rubbish disposal can be sorted out, this application should not be approved.
