

External Handrails Details and summary

Design Inspiration

The external handrail design pays reference to the elegantly curved handrails in the Church Nave, crafted with details unique to the setting and story of the Danish Church in London.

The external railing detail has been inspired by the Danish designer Mogens Koch's pulpit design in the Church Nave, as below left. Our details take on a similar curved nature, fixed directly into the stone.

Existing Condition

The existing railings at the Danish Church are key-clamp railings painted black, as shown below. Our proposal seeks to uplift the railing design with a higher quality material and more refined design.

As illustrated in the following pages, for balustrades we propose to use 16mm diameter circular bright mild steel sections painted black, fixed into the yorkstone coping. And a curved handrail design, similar to the pulpit, fixed into the limestone paving.
