Subject Heritage Statement for

Garden and Landscape Works.

The proposed garden changes / additions to both front and rear garden do not detract from building facade and appearance. The additions at the front (boundary fences, entrance gate and bin storage) respect the architecture and style of the existing building and match similar elements in the surrounding properties.

The proposed fences are meant to be made of cast iron and to match the design of the neighbouring property no. 117 to be inline with the style of the street. Same design will be applied also to the main gate.

The proposed bin shed want to replicate the design principles and style of the one built in the neighbouring property no. 117 in King Henry's Road. The structure will be made using bricks to match the ones used on the building and it will have slatted timber doors and a green roof above the structure. All these elements as per the pictures above of the existing bin shed.



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In regards to the Rear Garden the main addition consists in a Lean-to Glass House close to the rear party walls. It is located to the far end of the garden and behind tall hedges.

The height will be lower than the existing party walls to be discretely masked from the other neighbouring properties.

For its fixing methods we leased with a party wall surveyor and a glass house specialist that will carry a site survey to understand the best procedure to not damage the existing wall and guarantee its stability at the same time. In terms of aesthetic the glass house its made by aluminium and glass, this will help the structure to integrate at its best in the garden.
