We find the proposed height of the wall, as amended, would fail to enhance the character of the area as it would be unsympathetic to the prevailing height of most street-facing boundary walls, particularly for listed properties of this period. Combined with a proposed railing, it would be completely out of keeping. I attach a photo of the boundary wall of the Grade II* house. Cloth Hill.

I attach a photo of the boundary wall of the Grade II* house, Cloth Hill, which has an impressive listed railing but the boundary wall is much lower and is a retaining wall as well (caveat: we do not believe that the hoarding behind the railing is appropriate).

The proposal as revised, we believe, would be contrary to DH1 and DH2 of the Hampstead Neighbourhood Plan.

It would set an unfortunate precedent as well. As noted below, a similar application, though smaller in scale, for a boundary wall at a height of 2.3m, was reduced to 2m in response to neighbours' objections and objections from the Forum. Camden subsequently approved this revised proposal.

We could not support a proposed brick wall higher than 2m.

I can see that the applicant is now proposing a brick wall, mainly at a height of 2320mm, with railings above, and is still proposing to replace the sweet chestnut that has a TPO with another chestnut.

As an aside, 31 Grove Place (2019/5449/P), within sight of no. 26, recently received planning permission for a brick wall to replace a timber one, having reduced the proposed wall from 2300mm to 2m.
