The design of the new extension in Murray Street is completely out of character - the doors and windows should match the other properties on the south side of Murray St, both in style and design. The large slabs of wall are ugly and unwelcoming. The pale white bricks do not match the bricks that are used in houses generally in the area, which are London Stocks. This is, after all, a Conservation Area. The proposed garden boundary wall fronting Camden Square and Murray Street is too high. A design that matches other properties in the square would be more relevant and visually pleasing, and reflect the feel of the Conservation Area. The plan to build a raised platform in front of no 50 would block part of the substantial windows which face the square, and would make the house look squat. This plan should be abandoned. The plan to build a roof terrace and bar is unacceptable. Local residents would suffer from noise and possibly being overlooked. It is also inappropriate for this residential area. The plan to remove mature trees is also unacceptable. The proposed development will increase the usable event space by a huge amount. This will mean a large increase in the number of people using the Centre, and a corresponding large number of vehicles, including coaches and taxis, arriving at its doors. It will also increase the number of people leaving late at night, which will cause disruption to residents. Camden Square is a Victorian garden square made up of 60 + houses. It is completely residential, apart from the Irish Centre and a small church hall. Apart from a few shops, Murray Street is also residential. We consider that the proposed plans for the Irish Centre will create a building that is too large and with too many activities and visitors to be acceptable in a residential area. We therefore object to the development.
