The restaurant has caused me a great deal of grief to date and can only foresee that more customers will only make matters worse.</p> <p>FAN The existing FAN is not fit for purpose at present as it leaks and hardly touches the steam which is generated inside the existing restaurant. If they place a fan right outside my bedroom I object fervently, as it contravenes my 'right to the quiet, enjoyment of my living space' and therefore, by law prohibited.</p> <p>RUBBISH I move onto RUBBISH, a larger restaurant would generate more rubbish. The rubbish that the said restaurant tips out at night is already far too much for the space between the said restaurant Kitchen Entrance and my flat window and door to my flat. Rubbish by definition means waste substance which smells, it's also liable to attack by vermin, notwithstanding this the pigeons like to eat this substance causing damage and attack to bags left out for collection. The rubbish at present is a problem and is too much for such a small pavement and predominantly residential area.</p> <p>Noise: Regardless of the promises made to curtail this issue. The noise is a huge problem with groups of unruly youngster gathering outside very close to my bedroom window. This noise goes on until 11 pm - tip out time and beyond - as clientele makes their way home in a noisy boisterous fashion.</p> <p>The clientele for said restaurant are predominantly young. They have little regard for others. Which has been demonstrated on numerous occasions by myself. For example, I use a walking aid, and when I try to pass on the pavement they don't move forcing me onto the road. In addition when I ask them to move they have said 'do you own the pavement' in a word they are very rude and unruly.</p> <p>Smoking: Smoking occurs Right outside my flat and continually. Cigarette 'buts' are left outside my door and all over the pavement. Prohibited by law.</p> <p>The cooking smell is appalling, when it permeates my flat it makes me feel sick. Food is raw, cooked at/on table. Again, the smell is thus spoiling my Right to 'enjoy my flat' this is a right by law and should be adhered to.</p> <p>I hope the above will be considered when an Application to Extend the above named Restaurant is Heard by the Camden Committee.</p> <p>Red Lion Street is and has been a congenial and pleasant Road. Since opening in Spring 2018, the restaurant has caused a great deal of nuisance to the properties surrounding the restaurant. The planned extension to the restaurant will only make these issues worse.</p> <p>Living close to the restaurant I have experienced;</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Increased levels of noise: large groups smoking on the street outside, large groups leaving late at night, faulty extractor fans, additional extractor fans installed without planning permission, large groups of customers loitering outside the restaurant, loud arguments with takeaway delivery drivers.2. Cooking odour: the smell from cooking from the restaurant has often been smelt within local residential properties.3. Issues surrounding waste: excess waste often litters the front of the restaurant, refuse bags to this day continue to leak oil, a private refuse company collects the rubbish late at night disturbing our sleep. <p>Following a private review of Shu Jie Hot Pot's licence in October 2019, a number of additional conditions were imposed on the restaurant to improve conditions for local residents. To date the restaurant appear to have ignored the majority of these conditions.</p> <p>At the current restaurant capacity the restaurant is causing numerous grievances. With the ability to serve even more customers, the issues noted above will be exacerbated. In addition Shu Jie Hot Pot's reluctance to engage with the local authority and residents on the licence review, disregarding the majority of conditions, demonstrates they are unwilling to change their ways. Therefore - why should they be allowed to expand their operation?</p>
