2020/1647/P		04/05/2020 12:42:03	OBJ	<p>Dear Sir/Madam,</p> <p>I would like to object in regards to application 2020/1647/P which is for placing 5G masts on top of 1 St. GILES HIGH STREET.</p> <p>The application is firstly wrong in that the masts are not being placed on 1 St. GILES HIGH Street which is an office building. But they are being placed on</p> <p>Matilda Apartments, 4 Earnshaw St. London WC2H 8AJ</p> <p>1 St. Giles High Street and Matilda apartments is part of the Central St. Giles building complex however they are separate buildings are on different Streets and have different post codes.</p> <p>The application therefore is confusing as local residence will not realise that the masts are to be placed on their building, and should be refused simply on this ground alone.</p> <p>Furthermore I would also like to point out that Matilda Apartments is an residential building consisting of 53 apartments. It isn't called Matilda House as the planning application refers to it perhaps replacing the part of the name from Apartments to House is a way to remove the fact it is a residential Apartment Building in the application. It has never been called Matilda House and I can see no documentation to it ever being referred to in that name.</p> <p>I do not understand while there are so many options in the area to place these masts on top of office buildings that instead they are placed on top of a residential one.</p> <p>Placing the masts will not only cause disruptions to a Residential building in the instillation and maintenance of them but also that long time exposure to 5G and other radio wave can possibly increase the chance of cancer and therefore wouldn't it be better when having the option to reduce the possible risk and place them on office buildings where people spend significantly less time than a residential one.
