This tree has been managed by Down To Earth Trees for many years, and sadly it has declined considerably in both physiological and structural condition, which has been more rapid in the past two years. The report attached includes decay detection testing and also in depth soil analysis in March 2019, this resulted in the instruction from the site management to carry out soil amelioration and decompaction works with the addition of Biochar additives to the rooting environment June 2019 in an attempt to increase the overall condition of the tree.

Initially the signs were good after this work, and the tree quickly flushed with new lush growth and new seed pods, however this was a short lived boost and the tree now looks as it did pre soil amelioration works with sparse buds and minimal new extension growth.

The tree also presents large areas of flaking bark and branches with apical dieback which appears to have worsened this spring. The tree has already lost several large scaffold branches which have failed unexpectedly leading to concerns from the site management for the ground staff who operate under the tree, and also as the lawn is host to a summer events programme to numerous visitors who may use the tree for shade.

Sadly, the tree has little acceptable future life expectancy and now presents a safety hazard for the Inn, as such permission is sought to remove this tree to eliminate the hazard.
