7 trees in total along the border with Kenview, Fitzroy Park, N6 6HX (TPO references are T1SYC, T2SYC, T3SYC, T4HC, T5HC, T6HC, T7HC). Summery: All trees to be reduced to allow more light into Kenview (my client's) rear garden.

T1) T1SYC Reduce 4 longest lateral limbs that grow towards Kenview site by up to 30% or up to 3 metres.

T2) T2SYC Reduce overall crown by up to 30% or 2-3m in line with BS3998 standards of arboriculture.
T3) T3SYC Reduce overall crown by up to 30% or 2-3m in line with BS3998 standards of arboriculture.
T4) T4HC Reduce overall crown by up to 25% or 3-4 m. This tree has been previously reduced to this specification around 10 years ago, so the work should generally be back to previous within BS3998 standards. Also reduce or remove lower lateral growth that encroaches into Kenview garden (crown lift only on Kenview side) up to 4m height (Kenview garden has many shrubs and smaller trees up to this height (4m) and the lower Horse Chestnut growth is encroaching into these.)

T5) T5HC Reduce overall crown by up to 25% or 3-4 m. This tree has been previously reduced to this specification around 10 years ago, so the work should generally be back to previous within BS3998 standards. Also reduce or remove lower lateral growth that encroaches into Kenview garden (crown lift only on Kenview side) up to 4m height.

T6) T6HC Reduce overall crown by up to 25% or 3-4 m. This tree has been previously reduced to this specification around 10 years ago, so the work should generally be back to previous within BS3998 standards. It was noted to my client in 2009 that this tree has phytophthera so full aerial inspection will be carried out during works to ensure the continued health and safety of the tree. Also reduce or remove lower lateral growth that encroaches into Kenview garden (crown lift only on Kenview side) up to 4m height.

T7) T7HC Reduce overall crown by up to 25% or 3-4 m. This tree has been previously reduced to this specification around 10 years ago, so the work should generally be back to previous within BS3998 standards. Also reduce or remove lower lateral growth that encroaches into Kenview garden (crown lift only on Kenview side) up to 4m height.

The four horse chestnut trees have been reduced previously and the regrowth has formed a particularly dense and shady crown which is greatly impacting the resident's (Kenview) enjoyment of their garden. The proposed work will be carried out to the highest arboricultural standards as to not cause unnecessary damage to the long term health and safety of the trees. As far as I know the proposed specifications had been previously approved and carried out around 10 vears ago.

T8) This tree is in the Kenview property underneath T7. Small Lawson Cypress completely blocked out by T7HC. Tree to be removed as there is no further light or space for it to grow into. Very busy area of the garden especially with towering horse Chestnuts directly above. This tree is of little amenity value.
