As it stands, this fig tree appears to be in good health aside from requiring pruning that may be overdue.</p> <p>This tree plays a significant part in local biodiversity, as it is the only fruit tree in the immediate vicinity. The gardens are susceptible to weeds, ivy and thorns, as this is a long battle that I am up against and this tree is still resilient in the face of such pressures. It is aesthetically pleasing and of ecological interest.</p> <p>The tree forms a secondary boundary between no's 35 and 37 Primrose Gardens, as the existing brick wall is not high in stature. It is therefore reasonable to suggest that removal of this tree will impede the privacy of residents between both houses, at least below the second floor, and also that between us and 56-58 Belsize Park Gardens. I feel that the tree in question along with others at the boundary points, provide mental health and social benefits in naturally dividing premises amongst the community.</p> <p>I personally will be affected by this, and would mourn the unnecessary loss of a mature tree for no apparent reason.</p>
