Hi Georgia

Both your property and the one that immediately backs onto yours at 4 Cathcart Street are in The Inkerman Conservation Area and therefore a Tree Officer will have to issue a permission for the tree works.

You can request a prune back to the boundary with number 4 of the overhanging part of this tree and all we would need to do is inform number 4 that you have made the request and as it is encroaching your property boundary you are entitled to do so.
