The Council has considered your application dated 25 March 2020 and decided to refuse consent for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The lime tree is protected by a tree preservation order and is considered to provide visual amenity and make a reasonable contribution to the character of the conservation area.

The reasons given for the removal of the tree are that it has poor vigour and that it will detract from the new landscaping scheme. These are not considered to be sufficiently robust reasons to justify the removal of a tree that is protected by a tree preservation order.
