e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

London Plane Tree. The only one on the property. To reduce back to previous pollard points as per previous approvals 2013/3478/T dated 10.6.13 and 2016/6674/T dated 13.1.17.

Reason: neighboring property 14 Weech Road suffered subsidence and technical report dated 17.11.2011 prepared by Crawford and Co for insurers Aviva. Further report submitted by MWA Aboricultural dated 8.10.2012 identifies london plane tree roots are material cause of subsidence damage to 14 Weech Road. Application made to fell tree was not approved but approval given to reduce to previous pollard point in June 2013. Subsequent claim for negligence was made by Aviva against owner of plane tree claiming he should have been aware of subsidence risk caused by tree. This was not eventually proceeded with at court but Mr Smith is now fully aware that a failure to properly manage the trees growth could render him liable to future claims. It is the policy to maintain the tree at a height agreed under the previous approvals in 2013 and 2017.
