				I would, however, like to comment that with one whole wall of the new build constructed of glass, I can see no justification for the lantern on the roof of the proposed dining area space. This will, if permitted, be just inches from the window of the room above, causing likely light spill nuisance to the upstairs neighbours. In addition it will contribute to additional light pollution to the area in general - something we should all be working to reduce. May I suggest that if this application is to proceed the lantern should be removed from the proposal.

CRASH notes that the proposed extension is very similar to many others in the same, and neighbouring, streets, and does not wish to comment on the Applicant's overall scheme. CRASH does, however, have serious reservations about the inclusion of the proposed lantern. This rooflight rises to very much the same height – and is very close to - the window of the first floor flat, which we assume is not in the ownership of the applicant. Light spillape from the lantern will cause nuisance to any first floor residents, and will cause light pollution. CRASH would urge the Applicant to revise this aspect of the proposed works.
