Since all of the other documents are redacted, it is difficult to comment. However, I see there are trial pits and some arrows on the drawings, which suggest to me, that the very large and untended trees have now begun to affect drains and foundations.</p> <p>It is worth stating that in your reply to people who make applications, you should mention that they have a duty of care, both for Health and Safety reasons and since they live in a Conservation Area, that they should carry out regular pruning in order to restrict growth. In addition, if the trees were watered regularly, their roots will not be seeking the only source of water, their drains.</p> <p>The Cypress has little nature conservation. The chestnut looks healthy from the road side but like most other chestnuts in the area, probably has phyllostica fungus.</p> <p>Both trees are very large, adjacent to the house.</p> <p>We have no objection to their being removed.</p> <p>However, with the increased number of fellings within the Conservation Area, we are worried that the character of the area is being eroded. We therefore ask Camden Council to amend their policies and to ask home occupiers to plant replacement trees of a more suitable size and species for smaller gardens.</p> |
