Re: TREE PROBLEM

Hi there.

I am the owner of the house which back on to your property.

The tree in your back garden is causing a couple of problems and I 'm afraid it needs to be dealt with urgently.

Firstly as you're aware 2 large branches are severely damaged and now only loosely attached – you have had Jason at Tree Matters round to look at this, thanks. The branches largely hang over the upper part of my garden and are making that part of the garden un-usable, that's a real problem during summer and especially during lockdown. Can you please ensure that they are removed safely as soon as possible?

Secondly, the tree is knocking down the wall between our properties and this is becoming dangerous. Photos are attached below. I have sent messages previously on this to what I was told by residents was a relevant number for you but unfortunately didn't get a reply, I assume the number was wrong? Bricks are now starting to fall loose from the wall and putting it in danger of collapse, again this is making part of my garden unusable and unsafe. Subject to there being no council block on the tree being removed (I will ask) I would ask that you arrange for this to happen, again as soon as possible. Clearly damage to property and any injury to people could result in serious issues, costs and actions so hopefully this can be dealt with ASAP.

Thanks for your help with this, please let us know when the branches can be dealt with in the first instance and then when the tree can be removed – we are happy to cooperate with whoever is doing the work in terms of access etc.
