e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

This is a great tree with huge character but it is starting to increase with size. The clients are keen to get more light into the lawn area if possible. The conclusion was to remove some of the outer layer of young branches whilst still retaining the natural weeping shape beneath. This is relatively low impact tree work and I have specified 6 particular branches which if removed could assist with more ambient light to the lawn area ..These are shown in the photos attached in yellow. From the sideshot photos of the tree you can observe how big the branches are suggesting to be removed. The ones that protrude out.

T1 - Weeping Beech (Fagus Sylvatica "Pendula") - Reduce 6 elongated outer lateral branches (over no 34a) of no more than 3" in diameter growing over the inner crown back to the main scaffold limb to create a tighter less "outward" spread crown. There is one vertical branch from the centre of the crown that should be reduced to balance the tree. The branches are starting to remove a lot of light from the lawn area due to a build up of layers and the removal of these specified weeping branches would create more ambient light to the area. The removal would still retain the weeping affect of the Tree as there is substantial inner growth. It is considered better to remove them now before they get overly mature. Raise the crown lightly by approx 0.5m.
