Proposed Conditions

1. Signs to be displayed at all exits of the premises reminding customers to leave quietly.
2. Local residents to be supplied with a hotline number to use in the event of any concern about the premises during the operating hours.
3. Noise levels at a point of 1 metre from the premises shall be less than the existing background noise.
4. The premises licence holder shall ensure that CCTV cameras and recorders are installed at the premises and are of a standard acceptable to and approved by the Police.
5. The system shall be maintained in good working order and at all times the premises is open to the public, be fully operational covering both internal and external areas of the premises to which the public have access.
6. The CCTV camera views are not to be obstructed.
7. At least one CCTV camera is to be placed no more than seven feet above floor level; near to the exit in order to capture clear facial images of all persons leaving the premises.
8. The medium on which CCTV images are recorded shall be of evidential quality; stored securely; shall be retained for a period of 31 days; and be available for inspection by the Police or Local Authority upon request.
9. At all times when the premises are open for the purposes of licensable activities, a suitably trained member of staff shall be present to assist the Police or an authorised officer in obtaining the CCTV footage.
10. Copies shall be made available within 48 hours to the Police or Local Authority, upon request.
11. A facility to transfer the images to a compatible, removable format (such a USB stick or other format as agreed with the Police) shall be held on the premises.
12. If the CCTV is inoperative or not installed and working to the satisfaction of the Police then, within 48 hours the Police shall be notified and an estimate given of the repair timescale. The premises shall comply with all reasonable requests from the Police.

13. All flat surfaces in toilet cubicles, including any curved toilet roll holder ellipses, are to be 'designed-out' – to the satisfaction of the MPS – in order to prevent drug misuse.
14. The licensee will ensure that staff are trained, as appropriate, in respect of relevant Licensing Law; crime scene best practice and upon the sale of alcohol to drunks and to persons underage.
15. A Challenge 25 policy will be enforced, where any person reasonably looking under the age of 21 shall be asked to prove their age when attempting to purchase alcohol and signs to this effect will be displayed at the premises. The only acceptable forms of identity will those with photographic identification documents recognised in the Home Office guidance; including passports, photo-card driving licence, and proof of age card bearing the PASS hologram or military ID.
16. Police must be called to incidents of violence and/or disorder.
17. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Police, which will record the following:
 - a) All crimes reported to the venue
 - b) All ejections of patrons
 - c) Any incidents of disorder and violence
 - d) All seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - e) Any faults in the CCTV system
 - f) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
18. When a refusal to sell alcohol takes place due to the underage or drunkenness then the action should be recorded and the information made available on request to an authorised officer or the Police.
19. Whenever the premises are open for licensable activities, there will be a Personal Licence Holder on duty.
20. When the Premises Licence conducts licensable activities after midnight, or on other occasions where circumstances dictate there may be a higher risk than normal, the Premises Licence Holder will complete a written risk assessment as to the time and number of SIA registered door staff required to be on duty at the premises, and this risk assessment will be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority on request.
21. A written search and dispersal policy will be in place at the premises, and which will be available to the Police and Local Authority on request.
22. Licensable activities will only be permitted under this licence as long as The Adventure Bar Co Ltd is the Premises Licence Holder.
