The attached document is illegible.</p> <p>It would appear from the submitted photographs that the Pendunculate Oak (English Oak) is a poor specimen, which is in poor unstable condition. The Chinese privet (<i>Ligustrum lucidum</i>) and Cotoneaster appear to be large shrubs/small trees.</p> <p>However these three trees are visible from 35 to 41 Maresfield Gardens and the considerable number of apartments in 14 Netherhall Gardens. They therefore contribute to the Conservation Area and are an amenity.</p> <p>Consideration should be given to their amenity and also their health and condition. Should Camden be mindful to accept felling, the applicant should be required to replace with suitable trees so as not to damage the Character of the Conservation Area.</p>
