The Council, as a neighbouring planning authority, has considered your request for observations on the application referred to above and hereby raises no objection.

Informative(s):

1 Reason for No objection.

The application site is located on the southern corner side of Kilburn High Road this road forms the boundary of London Borough of Camden and the City of Westminster Council. In terms of design and appearance, the proposal would not front a conservation area nor a listed property. The tables and chairs would be enclosed with plant screening and is located on a parade of shops with existing al fresco areas which faces Kilburn high Road Overground station and bookies, is considered to not cause harm to its character of appearance towards Camden streetscene.

In respect of impact on the amenity of residents within Camden and Camden's transport network, given the siting of the development in relation to Camden across the busy classified road, it is considered it would not impact on either of these due to the existing nature of the area (A3/A5 uses) controlled by their own respective opening hours and such nature of works is immaterial to traffic and highway matters. As such no objection is raised.

Camden would encourage a development of a high quality design within this environment and a development of sustainability standards which would have minimal impact on residential amenity, social safety and public highway network. The application should be determined under Westminster's planning policies.
