London NW1 8QL The pedestrian areas in and around Camden Town Centre have benefitted form the relatively recent removal of street 'furniture' such as railings etc. This has significantly improved circulation around the tube station when crowded at the weekend and summer months. This proposal is not only incongruous, it takes up significant space on the footpath and blocks circulation. Camden Councils Local Plan policies D1 and D2 require that development is of the highest standard of design and that it respects local context and character. It also ensures that Camden's heritage assets and their settings, including conservation areas, listed buildings, archaeological remains, scheduled ancient monuments and historic parks and gardens are preserved and enhanced and promotes high quality landscaping and works to streets and public spaces. The height and design of the pole is out of keeping with the adjacent heritage buildings and townscape. This is a major junction and represents the 'front door' of Camden Town centre. It would be highly visible on the approach from Parkway, Camden High Street and on arrival from the underground station. The base of the mast appears huge but has no dimensions. It looks to be more than a 1.5m cube. The proposed cabinets in connection with this mast will further impede pedestrian flow and be a visual eyesore. They will inevitably be covered in promotional stickers or anti-climb paint. This is the wrong location for such a tall mast and associated boxes. There are other taller buildings in the area that could accommodate the facility of their roof or it could be located adjacent to taller buildings should the health risks to local resident and visitors be assessed to be acceptable. It is clear from additional planning applications that the applicant is seeking to
