Proposal: Display of internally illuminated signage to office entrance. Drawing Nos: Site Location Plan T90P100 1B, T90P00 1B, T10D01 1A, T20D01 1B.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant consent subject to the following condition(s):

Conditions and Reasons:

1 No advertisement is to be displayed without the permission of the owner of the site or any other person with an interest in the site entitled to grant permission.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

2 No advertisement shall be sited or displayed so as to (a) endanger persons using any highway railway waterway

(a) endanger persons using any highway, railway, waterway, dock, harbour or aerodrome (civil or military);

(b) obscure, or hinder the ready interpretation of any traffic sign, railway signal or

aid to navigation by water or air; or

(c) hinder the operation of any device used for the purpose of security or surveillance or for measuring the speed of any vehicle

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

3 Any advertisement displayed and any site used for the display of advertisements, shall be maintained in a condition that does not impair the visual amenity of the site.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

4 Any structure or hoarding erected or used principally for the purpose of displaying advertisements shall be maintained in a safe condition.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

5 Where an advertisement is required under these Regulations to be removed, the site shall be left in a condition that does not endanger the public or impair visual amenity.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

Informative(s):

1 Reasons for granting consent:

The display of 3 halo-lit signs and one non-illuminated sign to announce the office entrance at the street frontage is considered acceptable in terms of scale, design, location and method of illumination. The proposed signage is discreet and does not obscure any significant architectural or historic features. It is does not harm the character and appearance of the host building or the wider Bloomsbury Conservation Area.

The proposed signage will not have any adverse impact on neighbouring residential amenity or on the safety of vehicular or pedestrian traffic.

The site's planning and appeals history has been taken into account when coming to this decision.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policy D4 of the Camden Local Plan 2017, the London Plan 2017, and the National Planning Policy Framework 2019.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraph 38 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2019.
