However no evidence for damage to the neighbouring property was providing in previous application for felling exactly the same trees, made by the same neighbour (the applications were refused) and the neighbour has not provided any evidence this time, either. Our conservation area "The Gardens" is known to be leafy and full of trees and shrubs of all descriptions. These are beautiful mature trees of about a hundred years old and it makes no sense to fell them without a very good and proven reason. Enormous efforts are being made in London and throughout the country to plant more trees to benefit wildlife and combat global warning, and to fell mature trees without good reason flies in the face of the COuncil's greening and nature conservation efforts.
