11: Magnolia - (closest to the house): Remove the Rose from upper crown and reduce it back to main stems in the central crown area. Remove dead wood. Reduce and reshape the crown as is required after Rose removal (not more than 20%)

Reason: General maintenance as the Rose is adding to the trees wind sail area and is beginning to suppress some healthy leaf growth in the upper crown. T2: Japanese Maple: Reduce crown by approximately 20%. Thin crown density by 20%.

G1: Row of Magnolia Grandiflora: Reduce back over neighbouring property by approximately 1.00m. Reduce crown heights by 1.00m. Reduce over lawn by

approximately 0.50m. T3: Large Bay - (central bed): Reduce crown height by approximately 40%. Reduce lateral and sub-lateral branches as hard back as is practicable to balance (approximately 20%) and shape.

S1: Griselinia: Trim back to previous reduction points.
T4: Small Bay - (rear boundary): Reduce back to previous reduction points to control encroachment (approximately 20%).

T5: Cherry: Reduce section of crown by 20% which is overhanging the Mulberry.

Reasons: General maintenance and to control encroachment.
