	 A second site notice was displayed with the corrected site boundary after officers were made aware the original notice had been removed. The minor increase in height of the existing boundary fence would have no harmful design or amenity impacts and is considered acceptable.

	 No objection to pergola but no indication of how extra fencing will be erected.
	 Boundary line on site plan is inaccurate.
	 Please ensure the communal garden would not be used for the delivery or storage of building materials or for any building or construction work.
	Officer response
	 The applicant prepared additional visualisations to demonstrate that the addition to the fence would be constructed of the same open slats as existing.
	 A revised site location plan was received. Civen the proposal involves the installation of a small corden perceip.
	 Given the proposal involves the installation of a small garden pergola, it is not considered reasonable to secure a construction management plan to secure these matters. Given the small scale of the proposal, officers are confident they would be constructed without undue disturbance to neighbouring residents or require offsite storage of materials.
