Reason(s) for Refusal

- 1 The proposed demolition of the existing boundary treatment and proposed replacement boundary treatment would cause unacceptable harm to the character and appearance of the host property, streetscene and this part of the Redington and Frognal conservation area, contrary to policies D1 (Design) and D2 (Heritage) of the Camden Local Plan 2017.
- 2 The proposed development, in the absence of a legal agreement to secure a contribution towards public highway works and public realm would be likely to harm the borough's transport and public realm infrastructure, contrary to policies T1 (Prioritising walking, cycling and public transport) and T2 (Parking and car-free

development) of the Camden Local Plan 2017.
