It is our opinion that the commercial property market in Somers Town is on a decline due to the on High Street location and plus the lack of visibility of businesses from the main street. A typical example would be the empty shops on Eversholt Street. Local councillors have been rallying and promoting the market Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, but it is only taking place on Fridays.

In addition to all of this, original lease was for A1 usage, and afterwards the usage was not changed, only permission for D1 was granted.

The previous business, which tried to open D1 educational institution has never started trading, the premises were only used for a short period by Somers Town Islamic Cultural and Education Centre due to the Thames Water mains burst flooding on Churchway on 2 occasions.

Given the circumstances, I believe D1 usage was never in use or in force as a business never started trading.

Also, please look into legalities of non-usage of the new usage (in this case, D1) which should help to revert back the usage to the original A1 easier.
