It has caused two large cracks to the boundary wall to our house which run all the way through the wall from front to back and from top of the boundary wall to bottom. We are concerned that the wall could collapse on to the pavement which often has people walking by. There is insufficient space for such a large tree in the small flower bed between our boundary wall, bike shed and stone water feature.
