1 Reason for granting permission:

The London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (LSHTM) in Keppel Street are to carry out refurbishment works and provide a new plant deck and external services installations above roof level.

The existing roof of the courtyard building is to be refurbished to make provision for the new plant equipment.

Condition 4 of planning application 2017/7010/P, granted 7th March 2018 states:

'Not withstanding the data provided in the submitted Acoustic Report, before the use commences, the extract ventilating system/ air-conditioning plant shall be provided with acoustic isolation, sound attenuation and anti-vibration measures in accordance with the scheme, which shall be approved in writing by the local planning authority. All such measures shall thereafter be retained and maintained in accordance with the manufacturers' recommendations'

The applicant has submitted detailed information of the acoustic treatment and anti-vibration measures for the installation and fully addresses the requirements of Condition 4 of planning permission ref:2017/7010/P. These details are acceptable in environmental health terms and are considered sufficient for the condition to be discharged.

As such, the proposed details are in general accordance with policies A1, A4 and CC4 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.
