#### Proposal:

Replacement of the existing rear dormer with a new dormer including bi-fold aluminium doors and replacement of existing parapet wall with metal railings for the roof terrace at third floor level.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission subject to the following condition(s):

## Condition(s) and Reason(s):

1 The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

2 All new external work shall be carried out in materials that resemble, as closely as possible, in colour and texture those of the existing building, unless

otherwise specified in the approved application.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policies D1 and D2 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans- SLR\_20\_01\_001, SLR\_20\_01\_002, SLR\_20\_01\_003 Rev 01, SLR\_20\_02\_001 Rev 01, SLR\_20\_02\_003 Rev 01.

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt and in the interest of proper planning.

### Informative(s):

1 Reasons for granting permission:

The proposed development is not considered to cause harm to the character and appearance of the subject property or wider conservation area. The current proposal is similar to what was previously approved on 17.4.15 ref: 2014/7560/P. The dormer would remain subordinate to the host building in terms of bulk and remain appropriate in design; the proposed replacement windows would continue to respect the hierarchy of fenestration using appropriate materials. As revised, the roof of the dormer would remain solid and flat with an overhang and the cheeks would be made of zinc as opposed to being glazed. Removal of the parapet above the rear bay window and replacement with railings is considered acceptable, the principle of which has been previously approved. The replacement black metal railings would be discreet in nature, with a simple design and would be of a similar height to the existing parapet, and as such, are considered an appropriate alternative to the existing parapet wall.

The proposal would involve no increase in bulk or usege and would not afford any new views. As such, it is not considered that there would not be any detrimental impact to neighbouring residential amenity.

No objections were received following statutory consultation. The site's planning history and relevant appeal decisions were taken into account when coming to this decision. Special regard has been attached to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the conservation area, under s.72 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act 2013.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policies D1, D2 and A1 of the Camden Local Plan (2017). The proposed development also accords with the policies of the London Plan (2016), the London Plan intended to publish (2019) and National Planning Policy Framework (2019).

This approval does not authorise the use of the public highway. Any requirement to use the public highway, such as for hoardings, temporary road closures and suspension of parking bays, will be subject to approval of relevant licence from the Council's Streetworks Authorisations & Compliance Team
