Currently, there is an alignment with the Rare Disease Hospital's frontage and the wider open pathway that resulted is part of the character and amenity of the street.</p>

The application refers to ¿retention of existing railings at ground floor level¿, however these railings were installed in May 2020, without, as far as I can tell, planning permission to do so. The area enclosed by the railings was previously pavement. As the pavement is now much narrower as a result, social distancing on the pavement is much harder. The installation of the railings was not in keeping with the local area, and I would have objected to the planning application for the installation of them earlier in the year, if there had been one.</p>
