This short presentation summarizes the lighting design developments for the exterior of the Chapel of Lincoln's Inn, and is issued as part of formal Planning and Faculty applications.



THE CHAPEL EXTERIOR THE CHAPEL EXTERIOR

Elevations

The proposals are to provide backlighting to the wonderful stained-glass windows of the chapel by carefully positioning lanterns on the tops of new brackets that carry reproduction historic lanterns.

The lanterns provide gentle light to the surrounding exterior of Old Square area as well as casting a soft illumination to the arched entrances to the undercroft.

THE UNDERCROFT

Concept

The undercroft is a relatively rhythmic space and whilst the ribs and vaulting are decorated and discourage any significant intervention, the paving is plain, with the precedent of being lifted for the installation of services below.


We therefore propose a very simple uplighting scheme to highlight the vaulting and provide simple illumination through the space.

Impact

Given the many precedents of lifting the paving we consider that there will relatively little impact for this scheme and have also ensured that the uplighting positions fall in the centre of slabs rather than across joints.
