Thank you for your letter/telephone call of 28 September 2020 giving notice that the above tree(s) are considered dead/dying /dangerous and require emergency works.

The Council confirms that the remedial works as described above are exempt from the need for further notifications or any formal application to the Council and you are therefore allowed to proceed.

Informative(s):

- 1 You are advised that the appropriate standards for tree work are set out in BS 3998: 2010. Failure to ensure that the proposed works are carried out to these standards may result in damage to the tree(s) and may result in legal action by the Council.
- Please note that any approval given by the Council does not give an exemption from the requirements to comply with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), or any other Acts offering protection to wildlife. Of particular note is the protection offered to bats, birds and their nests from construction works. For further information contact Natural England on 0300 060 4911 or www.naturalengland.org.uk.

Under section 213 of the Town and Country Planning Act the owner of the tree has a statutory obligation to plant a replacement tree at the property. The Council considers that a rowan tree (Sorbus aucuparia), 12-14cm in circumference at 1m above the root ball would be a suitable replacement. The tree should be planted and maintained in accordance with BS8545:2014 - Trees from the nursery to independence in the landscape. Failure to replace the tree may result in the Council serving a tree replacement notice.
