But the proposed aerial masts and associated works would, in my view, continue seriously to detract from the appearance of the building itself and the nearby Conversation Area. The aerials will be clearly visible projecting above the existing roofline when viewed from Primrose Hill and the Conservation Area. They couldn't have chosen a more visible and exposed place on which to site the aerials. It seems to me that the detriment from the visual impact and on the local environment outweighs the benefit that the proposals might have in terms of improving local network provision.</p>
