Regarding the proposed Planning Application I strongly OBJECT on the following grounds and have attached photos taken on the 15th December as proof to my points.

There are far too many planters 3 would suffice they are not maintained are just growing weeds with no planned arrangement or continuity so look a mess. They are neglected and even at this Xmass time there is no interest by those who want to enhance their businesses to decorate them or make them look nice. They block the pathway to the pavement so no wheelchair or someone with walking sticks can manoeuvre around them. They are in fact a hazard to the elderly that actually live in the village as opposed to those in favour, under your comments, who are not residents here. In effect they block access to a public walk way.

Benches again are arranged in such a way that along with the planters encase the whole area inhibiting any free passage through them for anyone one who wishes to avoid getting caught in the enclosure that has been formed. In fact it turns the whole area into private space to serve the restaurants who do not maintain or have any interest in maintaining this additional area to their restaurants. This has been historically a free passage area but this scheme blocks any access at all for those that are mobilly challenged or to pedestrians that wish to avoid having to squeeze past tables or walk around benches leaving only the pavement behind them for access.

The pavement area where the new dustbins have been placed is very narrow due to the tree and the bicycle parking and as is shown by my photos has become a dumping area for all rubbish from everywhere which all this week has blocked the pavement making it unpassable. So along with the planters and the benches what was Public space is being denied to those who do not wish to mix with restaurant visitors. The Residents are having historic public quite enjoyment communal space changed into retail space with no thought at all as to other peoples interest or access to the other retail units ie: the chemist, vets or hairdressers.

I understand that the restaurants are putting this planning through on the basis or enhancement but this scheme is not it.

Put the 2 or 3 benches back where they have been forever and perhaps 2-3 planters well spaced to allow through traffic for pedestrians and to other shops. The restaurants can still have some tables in the area but the area stays public space and not only restaurant space.

As for the rubbish problem although it was bad before now it is a hazard as well as an eyesore. It is too close to the bicycle parking. I am afraid I have no solution to this problem.

I have tried to upload photos but it appears that evidence to back up comments is not allowed . Perhaps the Officer in charge will contact me by email so that I can supply the evidence that I wish the Council to take into account.

There is only one Notification of this planning application posted on one lamppost by a planter. None have been erected in any of the residential streets directly accessing this area or along Belsize Lane itself!!!!. Some local residents I have spoken to are completely unaware of the changes being proposed this cannot be the correct way to gather honest local opinions either in support of or objections to the proposal
