This development is not appropriate for the following reasons, and I request that the Council reject it: - the door design is in metal: this is a big change from the current wood doors, which blend in with the fencing the whole of the length of the street. - The proposed door(s) are also larger than at present: this will give an ¿industrial¿ appearance that would not be in keeping with the rest of the street. - the proposal will add to the traffic in the street and, given its narrow width, it would be hard to exit the garage when cars are parked, as at present, along the other side of Christchurch Hill. - All properties in Gainsborough Gardens already have private parking. This proposal would add to the traffic in the area and, even if inadvertently, add to the number of vehicles per property, in clear breach of Camden¿s policy on car ownership, traffic, and parking. - We note that the garage is not, at present, used actively for parking a car nor vehicular access, and has not been for the 2 decades that we have lived here. This is not, therefore, a simple conversion, but rather addition of a new garage to a street that has neither has one, nor needs it.
