Sir,

Town and Country Planning Act, 1932.
Town and Country Planning (General) Interim Development
Order, 1932.

With reference to your application dated 19th January 1935, I am directed to inform you that the Council in exercise of its powers under the above-named Order hereby permits you to erect three blocks of flats on the site of No. 1 Rockwall Gardens, Hampstead, in accordance with the Drawings Nos. 141172 Reg. No. 1972 submitted, subject to:-

- (1) no portion of the lower ground floor of Block A being used for habitable purposes;
- (2) the whole of the sanitary arrangements, particularly as regards ventilation of the water closets in Block B being to the satisfaction of the Local Authority;
- (3) the provision of satisfactory arrangements for the parking of vehicles on the site; and
- (4) compliance with the provisions of the London Building Act, 1930, where they are inconsistent with the consent.

The permission is given in variation for that conveyed to you in the Council's letter dated 4th February, 1935 so far as it relates to the deviations indicated on the plans mentioned above and is subject also to due compliance with local (Act), regulation, building byelaw and general statutory provisions in force in the area and nothing herein shall be regarded as dispensing with such compliance or be deemed to do a consent by the Council thereunder.

I would also remind you that the Council's permission does not modify or affect any personal or restrictive covenant applying to the land or the rights of any person entitled to the benefit thereof.

I have to add that with regard to the suggested stand back of the ground in front of the principal rooms at lower ground floor level the Council is not prepared to approve the raising of a new block of flats with rooms to be used for habitable purposes situated below the level of the adjoining ground to the extent proposed.
