I am the Power of Attorney to and daughter of Mrs Irene Hardy [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] I am registered as such with Camden Council.

**I am writing to you, on her behalf, to object to planning application  
2020/5643/P**

She has owned her Ornan Road flat for over 35 years and, before that, lived on Belsize Lane.  
**The removal of the cladding disrupts the style** embedded in the area by 1960s architecture (Village Close & beyond) and 1960s-style architecture (mimicking the Village Close houses) which has given the Belsize Village area a continuity of style only interrupted by a very few Edwardian & older properties which survived the WW2 bombs.

To have a house with the **cladding removed would interrupt a significant design element** which has become a legacy feature of the area.

Exposing new brick would not mirror complement the predominant 1960s style. Nor would it chime with the minority of older buildings.
