## Notes on viewability from British Museum spaces



3. Image to the right hand side is taken from the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor office window of the White Wing, British Museum. The proposed louvre extension is shown by the dotted line indicatively.




- Facade shaded green is White Wing 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup>
  floor offices for British Museum staff. The
  windows of this internal office space has a direct
  line of sight of the plant and enclosure.
- Façade shaded red is high level windows within Gallery 1. As these windows are circa 6 meters above finished floor level within the gallery, no viewability of the plant is possible from the windows.



- 4. Image on the left hand side shows the view of the existing louvre from the British Museum's internal East Access Road ground level.
- 5. The proposed extension of the louvre has been shown in orange for ease, final installation would be finished to match existing louvres.

## Notes on viewability from external buildings

- Façade shaded green is 22 Montague St. It is expected a narrow view of the plant will be possible from the windows. A vertical extension of the acoustic compound would mitigate this.
- Façade shaded red is 1 Montague St which is British Museum property currently used internally. Due to the raised parapet wall shown with red arrows, the proposed chiller plant or extension of the louvre will not be visible from this vantage point.





3. The image on the left hand side shows the view of the existing louvre compound from 22 Montague St east footpath. Enclosure circled yellow for clarity. The 600mm extension would be negligible from this vantage point.
