Informative(s):

1 Reasons for granting listed building consent (delegated):

18 Holly Mount dates from the early/mid-18th century. The building was a beer shop in 1830s, then Holly Mount Laundry in 1850s and a lodging house at the turn of the 20th century.

The proposal is for the formation of an en-suite bathroom at first floor level along with the removal of a small section of modern, unsympathetic wall panelling and a section of built-in furniture.

The proposed changes are considered to not to harm the architectural significance of the listed building and are supported.

The site's planning history has been taken into account when making this decision

Special regard has been attached to the desirability of preserving the listed building and its features of special architectural or historic interest, under s.16 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act (ERR) 2013.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policies D1 and D2 of the Camden Local Plan 2017. The proposed development also accords with the London Plan 2016 and the National Planning Policy Framework.
