DECISION

Town and Country Planning Act 1990

Advertisement Consent Granted

Site in front of 162 Grays Inn Rd London. WC1X 8ED.

Proposal:

Display of new double sided digital screen at relocated bus shelter.

Drawing Nos: Site Location Plan, Relocation Bus Shelter CAM8108AB.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant consent subject to the following condition(s):

Conditions and Reasons:

1 No advertisement is to be displayed without the permission of the owner of the site or any other person with an interest in the site entitled to grant permission.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 2 No advertisement shall be sited or displayed so as to
 - (a) endanger persons using any highway, railway, waterway, dock, harbour or aerodrome (civil or military);
 - (b) obscure, or hinder the ready interpretation of any traffic sign, railway signal or

aid to navigation by water or air; or

(c) hinder the operation of any device used for the purpose of security or surveillance or for measuring the speed of any vehicle

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

3 Any advertisement displayed and any site used for the display of advertisements, shall be maintained in a condition that does not impair the visual amenity of the site.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

4 Any structure or hoarding erected or used principally for the purpose of displaying advertisements shall be maintained in a safe condition.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

Where an advertisement is required under these Regulations to be removed, the site shall be left in a condition that does not endanger the public or impair visual amenity.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

The advertisement display shall be statically illuminated and the intensity of the illumination of the digital signs shall not exceed 600 candelas per square metre in line with the maximum permitted recommended luminance as set out by 'The Institute of Lighting Professional's 'Professional Lighting Guide 05: The Brightness of Illuminated Advertisements' 2015.

Reason: To ensure that the advertisement create a distraction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic and therefore cause a hazard to highway safety. In accordance with the requirements of policies A1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan 2017 and Transport for London Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.

7 The digital sign shall not display any moving, or apparently moving, images (including animation, flashing, scrolling three dimensional, intermittent or video elements).

Reason: To ensure that the advertisement does not create a distraction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic and therefore cause a hazard to highway safety. In accordance with the requirements of policies A1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan 2017 and Transport for London Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.

8 The minimum display time for each advertisement shall be 10 seconds.

Reason: To ensure that the advertisement does not create a distraction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic and therefore cause a hazard to highway safety. In

accordance with the requirements of policies A1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan 2017 and Transport for London Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.

9 The interval between advertisements shall take place over a period no greater than one second; the complete screen shall change with no visual effects (including fading, swiping or other animated transition methods) between displays and the display will include a mechanism to freeze the image in the event of a malfunction.

Reason: To ensure that the advertisement does not create a distraction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic and therefore cause a hazard to highway safety. In accordance with the requirements of policies A1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan 2017 and Transport for London Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.

No advertisement displayed shall resemble traffic signs, as defined in section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Reason: To ensure that the advertisement does not create a distraction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic and therefore cause a hazard to highway safety. In accordance with the requirements of policies A1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan 2017 and Transport for London Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.

11 The footway and carriageway on the Transport for London Road Network (TLRN) and Strategic Road Network (SRN) must not be blocked during the installation and maintenance of the advertising panel. Temporary obstruction during the installation must be kept to a minimum and should not encroach on the clear space needed to provide safe passage for pedestrians, or obstruct the flow of traffic.

Reason: To ensure that the advertisement does not create a distraction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic and therefore cause a hazard to highway safety. In accordance with the requirements of policies A1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan 2017 and Transport for London Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.

Informative(s):

1 Reasons for granting permission:

This application has been submitted alongside six other similar schemes involving the relocation of bus-shelters as part of the Gray's Inn Road redevelopment scheme, which includes the creation of a new cycling lane and necessitates the relocation of bus shelters.

Advertisements displayed on highways structures have deemed consent under Schedule 3 Class 9 of the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007, provided that they do not exceed 2.16sqm in area and are not illuminated. The proposed adverts require consent due to the size and internal illumination of the digital screens. The Regulations permit the Council to only consider amenity and public safety matters in determining advertisement

consent applications.

The digital screen displays are considered acceptable in terms of their size, design, location and method and level of illumination. These adverts are considered typical of the city centre street scene and the proposed display is not considered to cause any harm to public amenity. The relocated bus shelter shall be placed on a new traffic island with the benefit of freeing up additional space for pedestrians on the pavement.

Double sided digital display screens integral to the bus shelter structure shall be installed. The dimensions of the totem displaying adverts shall be approximately 2.4m x 1.3m with a depth of 0.35m. The display screens set into the totem shall be approximately 1.9m x 1m. The illumination of the screens will be limited to 600c/dm2 which shall be secured by condition attached to this decision.

It is accepted that the illuminated advert will cause some light spill; however, with the relocated position of the bus-shelter, following development this is considered to be an improvement on the existing arrangement and would not harm the amenity of any nearby residents.

The proposal is not considered detrimental to highways safety. As the advertisement would be seen by drivers and cyclists in moving traffic, this decision includes a condition that restricts the display of moving images. On balance, the advertisements are not considered to be hazardous to vehicular or pedestrian traffic and therefore raise no public safety concerns.

The site planning history has been taken into account during the assessment of this application. No objections were received prior to making this decision.

Special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the Conservation Area, under s.72 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act (ERR) 2013.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policies A1, D2, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan 2017. The proposed development also accords with the London Plan 2016 and National Planning Policy Framework 2019.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraph 38 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2019.
