Tree is a common Cedar wood pine tree it is causing significant harm to our lawn. Our lawn is overgrown with turf which previous owner tried with multiple failed attempts to treat. It will be a persistent problem as long as the Cedar pine tree is growing as its growing very fast and increases the humidity in the garden.

Deodar Cedar, fast growing casting shadow and harming the surrounding environment in our garden. Overgrown with turf due to persistent shadow and increased moisture. Low value tree, does not have any impact of surroundings of significant value. Replant tree will stand in same position, but will not be as obstructive as the Cedar pine tree. I will replant either a Japanese apricot, redbud 'forest pansy' or Korean dogwood. Which are all trees that stay small and are much easier to maintain as well as it will not obstruct the garden in the same way. It will also allow more diversity and attract pollinators and increase biodiversity in our rear garden.
