Dear Planners,

2021/0510/T. 38 A Dartmouth Park Road Fell 1xDeodar Cedar.

I disagree with the owner's opinion that it is 'a low value tree', with its attractive drooping branches and large cones. However, these Himalayan Cedars can reach 40 -70' in height and 20 x 40' in lateral spread and is probably not suitable for a rear overlooked London garden. The owner's suggested replacement non-native trees, the Japanese Apricot reaches 20', the red bud forest pansy up to 5m and the Korean Dogwood can attain 25'.

I also realise that due to its habit that this Cedar would be difficult to prune.

I suggest that if you do decide to fell the tree that a native tree replacement could also be considered. (The application states that the tree has a TPO. I cannot find evidence for this).
