Approximately 6.00m. Reduce crown height by approximately 30%. Reduce lateral and sub lateral crown spread by 30-40% in order to form a more compact crown structure.

Reason: General maintenance.

T5: Sycamore:

Approximately 17.00m. Prune torn out stubs back to main stem.

Reason: General maintenance.
