LEADING RESEARCH SCIENTISTS IN THE UK WELCOME AND SUPPORT THE PROPOSED MSD DISCOVERY RESEARCH CENTRE IN KING'S CROSS

The critical importance of the life sciences industry in our world today is clearly demonstrated in the fight against Covid-19, where scientific innovation and partnership is fueling collective efforts to save and improve lives globally, in this pandemic and beyond.

We are therefore writing to voice our support for a new, purpose-built, state-of-the-art discovery research centre for biopharmaceutical company MSD in King's Cross.

Subject only to planning permission from Camden Council this month, an application by Precis Advisory to replace a self-storage building directly opposite King's Cross Station would see the development of a UK headquarters and discovery research centre for MSD.
