Front Garden:

T1: Oak: Remove major dead wood throughout the crown. Thin crown density by 15%. Raise crown over neighbouring property by up to 2.00m, (low minor branches only).

Rear Garden:

T2: Beech: Thin crown density by approximately 20-25%. Remove dead wood throughout.

T3: Holly: Reduce overlong branches by approximately 1.00-1.50m back into main crown structure in order to shape and balance the crown.

T4: Sycamore: Thin crown density by 20-25 %, selecting strongest branches for retention. Reduce back to previous, most recent reduction points whilst retaining a suitable amount of furnishing growth to ensure crown continuity and promote a more natural crown structure. Remove dead wood. Remove decaying sub ended branches.
G1: Row of Leyland Cypress: Reduce lateral and sub-lateral overhang (tip prune) as is practicable whilst preserving screen and healthy crown structure.

Reasons: General maintenance and to control encroachment.
