Application 2020/5811/P Havercourt 147-151, Haverstock Hill Belsize Park, London NW3 4QX. Installation of 2no. antennas, 2no. cabinets at roof level and 1no. meter cabinet at ground level and associated works.

Visual Impact

Havercourt is on the edge of Belsize Park Conservation Area in Haverstock Hill and immediately abutting the Parkhill Conservation Area.

Installing these proposed telecoms apparatus will significantly hinder both Conservation Areas because they will be very visible from the ground and so will harm the character and appearance of the area.

Facing NW elevation [see site plan drawing, page 3]

At the SE end/ left of building:

PROPOSED TEF 1 No. ANTENNA ON WALL MOUNTED POLE STOOD ON PLINTH: 5.71 mtrs above roof level* 3.57 mtrs above plant room Level.

Please note, according to the site plan drawing on page 2, this pole should be to the left of the plant room, not (as shown on page 3) in front of it,.


In the middle of building:

PROPOSED TEF 1 No. ANTENNA ON WALL MOUNTED POLE STOOD ON PLINTH: 4.75 mtrs above roof level*

2.1 mtrs above plant room Level.

*5.71 meters is 18.73 feet and 4.75 meters is 15.58 feet - **the proposed antenna above the roof level are very tall**. The argument that they are not much higher than the existing plant rooms is wrong because 3.57 meters is still too high.

Schools/ Colleges/ Nurseries

UK Government Research in the Stewart Report (2000) identified that children are more susceptible to telecommunications radiation, and so the NPPF carries forward the principle of the 'consideration of the siting of masts close to schools through the requirement for developers to pre-consult with local schools'. Conerstone's ISSSI state that "no schools or nurseries were within 0.3 miles" of the site, consequently no schools or nurseries were consulted. However Google maps identifies there are in fact five schools/ colleges/ nurseries within 0.3 miles [482.8 meters] of the site - which need to be consulted with before this application can be determined.

Antrim Grove Playground —175 metres
Three Acres Pre-school — 324 meters
St Christopher School — 425 meters
Rosary Catholic Primary School —450 meters

Health and Safety

Whist Planning Authorities are not permitted to "set health safeguards different from the ICNIRP guidelines for public exposure.." [National Planning Policy Framework, para 116], Camden Council also has an overriding obligation to safeguard the health of its constituents by virtue of -

s.2B of the National Health Service Act 2006:

- 1. Each local authority must take such steps as it considers appropriate for improving the health of the people in its area.
- 2. The Secretary of State may take such steps as the Secretary of State considers appropriate for improving the health of the people of England.
- 3. The steps that may be taken under subsection (1) or (2) include—

 - (e) providing assistance (including financial assistance) to help individuals to minimise any risks to health arising from their accommodation or environment;
 - (f) providing or participating in the provision of training for persons working or seeking to work in the field of health improvement;
 - (g) making available the services of any person or any facilities."

For these reasons, this application should be refused.
